## It's time to do a little diggin'!

April is a great time to plant! Planting this month gives your trees, shrubs, and bedding plants time to settle their roots before it gets hot enough for watering to be a chore, giving them a foundation to support abundant flowers and fruit. **ferti-lome** Root Stimulator as a final step at planting will also help enhance this critical root development. Although it seems we've had a good bit of rain already, remember that your plants cannot store water and they depend on you for the extra moisture they require to remain healthy and colorful. Fertilizing with **ferti-lome** Tree & Shrub Food will keep most trees, shrubs, and groundcovers performing their best, and if you have acid-loving plants such as Azaleas, Hollies, Gardenias, and Magnolias, **ferti-lome** Azalea/Evergreen Plus will keep them green while preventing such buggy problems as whiteflies and scale. You may plant fruiting trees, bushes, and vines now, and if you're thinking of trying summer vegetables this year, it's an excellent time to get them started. You may also plant summer flowering bulbs such as Lilies, Glads, and Dahlias now, and when night-time temps are staying in the sixties, the soil will be warm enough for Caladium bulbs to go in. You will want to apply **ferti-lome** Lawn Food + Iron some time during the first two weeks of April to help your grass stay gorgeously green, and April is also a good month to apply **ferti-lome** Systemic Insecticide Drench to any pest-prone plants to prevent insect damage later in the year. ## “Bed”time Stories....

It is certainly time to think about your bedding plants for summer. Even though your Pansies may still look good, you need to get your warm season color such as Begonias, Zinnias, and Impatiens planted sooner rather than later so they can get established before the weather really heats up. This allows them to form the proper root system to support all the flowers they'll be producing this season. Adding soil to your beds before you plant them will also help provide proper drainage and extra nutrients for your flowers, as well as replacing the soil that is lost when you pull up your winter color. We carry a complete line of soil amendments including our own **Green Thumb Nursery Planting Mix**, composted Cow Manure and Mushroom Compost, and Worm Castings, all of which will add organic matter to your beds that your plants will love. Be sure and work these additions in to the existing soil somewhat so you do not have two separate layers, as this can make it hard for the roots of the plants to take up the proper amount of water.

It does not tolerate soggy soil, however, so if you have heavy clay soil that holds water, be sure to amend your bed when you plant with enough of our **Green Thumb Nursery Planting Mix** to ensure adequate drainage.

addition to your mixed shrub border. We also have the even smaller growing "Bombshell" Panicle Hydrangea in stock. Featuring big, fluffy, white clusters of blooms, Bombshell grows to between one and a half to three feet tall, and like all the Panicle Hydrangeas, makes a great cutting flower, too. The Panicle Hydrangeas can tolerate a little more sun than their mophead cousins, but they do need good drainage, so amend your soil with **Green Thumb Nursery Planting Mix** to prevent root rot.

## Now's the time for your first feeding with Lawn Food plus Iron!

The first two weeks of April is the recommended window for Lawn Care Club members to apply the first application of **ferti-lome Lawn Food + Iron**. For those of you who are not yet in the club, we recommend this particular product for right now because the slow-release formula it contains will produce a healthy, deep green lawn without producing the excess leaf growth that can lead to fungal problems in your grass. If you are having trouble with broadleaf weeds such as dandelions or clover, you could substitute a treatment of **ferti-lome Weed Out** in the red bag instead to feed your lawn and kill the weeds at the same time. If you didn't get a pre-emergent out in February, we would also recommend applying **Hi-Yield Weed & Grass Stopper** to keep any more weed seeds from coming up. Club members, you may also pick up your bonus bags of insecticide now if you so desire so it will be on hand in May when it is the proper time for it to be applied.

You may spray weeds that are up with **ferti-lome Weed Free Zone** while nighttime temperatures are still cool, and Bermuda or Zoysia lawns may be sprayed with **ferti-lome Bermuda Grass Weeder** once evening temps are in the high 60's. Centipede or St. Augustine lawns, or any lawn with Nutgrass problems, may be sprayed with **Image**. We also recommend using **Hi-Yield Spreader Sticker** with any liquid weed killer you spray so that the chemical can cling to the leaf of the weed long enough to be properly absorbed.
